While listening to a Mother's Day sermon in 1909 in Spokane, WA, Sonora Smart Dodd decided to work for the creation of a similar observance for fathers. Since her single father had raised her after her mother's premature death, Mrs. Dodd wanted to recognize her dad's efforts near his June birthday. In 1926, a National Father's Day Committee was organized and 30 years later the U.S. Congress made the holiday official. In 1972, President Richard M. Nixon established a permanent observance of Father's Day to be held annually on the third Sunday of June. Today we thank God for all men whose selflessness and love mirror God's love and generosity.

The Rev. Rene Perez, superintendent of the Central Massachusetts District, has authorized Pastor Joel to preside. Only business in harmony with the call to conference will be transacted.
