### **Why Are United Methodists Celebrating Communion More Often?**

"We receive spiritual nourishment through Holy Communion. The Christian life is a journey, one that is challenging and arduous. To continue living faithfully and growing in holiness requires constant sustenance. John Wesley wrote, 'This is the food of our souls: This gives strength to perform our duty, and leads us on to perfection' ('The Duty of Constant Communion,' 1.3). God makes such sustenance available through the sacrament of the Eucharist. In John 6:35, Jesus tells the crowd: 'I am the bread of life. Whoever comes to me will never be hungry, and whoever believes in me will never be thirsty.' As we return to the Table again and again, we are strengthened repeatedly. We go out empowered to live as disciples, reconcilers, and witnesses. In the words of the prayer after Communion, 'Grant that we may go into the world in the strength of your Spirit, to give ourselves for others . . .'" (UMH; page 11).
