FROM PASTOR JOEL

Dear Friends in Christ,

The idea for this pastoral letter came to me a few minutes ago, literally, while I was almost conked out in a dentist's chair. Don't worry. My teeth are fine. God has given me a great set of choppers. And I know from past experience what happens when I fail to take good care of them. So I brush two times each day. I floss and rinse with fluoride every night. And, twice a year, I get a good cleaning at the dental practice where I have been seen by a well-trained dental hygienist named Stephanie for something like ten years. When it comes to taking good care of my dental health, Stephanie is my guru. She's the best!

Every six months - whether I need it or not - Stephanie makes sure I park myself for an hour in her chair. She examines my teeth as soon as I sit down to confirm that "everything still feels good." With some gentle poking, I can feel her measuring for any recession that has taken place between my gums and the teeth they're designed to hold strongly in place. Then she uses a special tool kit to scour away the plaque that inevitably builds up between our six-month visits. Finally, she polishes and flosses the uppers and the lowers before calling one of the dentists she works for to pronounce me free and clean.

If I'm not mistaken, the dental smock Stephanie was wearing on Tuesday was lavender or purple. (Can you see where I'm going?) It was as if Stephanie already knew before I did that our twice-a-year cleanings share something in common with the Church's two purple seasons, Advent and Lent. In other words, I wonder if Stephanie recognized before I figured it out - just before writing this letter - that my daily prayers and home-based spiritual practices inevitably need to be augmented by a semi-annual check-up and clean-up. The steps I take each day to maintain my spiritual health - things like Scripture, Christian reading, prayer, and so on - as important as they are, need a regularly scheduled examination and cleaning to insure that "everything still feels good." So the Church, in its wisdom, gives us Advent and Lent, two purple seasons to prepare for the two festive white seasons: Christmas and Easter.

At Sudbury UMC, we do purple right! Each Sunday, a weekly theme is introduced early in worship to give us all something to chew on. This year's Advent focus, for example, is called the "Jesse Tree" - a symbolic representation of the promise in Isaiah 11:1, "A shoot shall come out from the stump of Jesse, and a branch shall grow out of his roots." Since the Gospels agree that Jesus was a descendant of King David, Christians have often used an Advent "Jesse Tree" - named for David's father - to identify and illustrate for children the Hebrew forebears whose lives were also the branches of the ancient family tree that gave us our Savior.

Each week on Wednesdays in Advent and Lent (look for specifics elsewhere in this newsletter), we gather for a warm bowl of soup, the fellowship of conversation and, finally, an age-appropriate worship or learning experience that builds on each year's seasonal theme. Some members of Sudbury UMC have been participating in these purple season series for more than forty years. Others have never given them a try. Getting them to come to church in the middle of the week, you might say, is like "pulling teeth." But all of us need what Advent and Lent offer - a twice-a-year spiritual check-up and cleaning.

So, if you haven't guessed by now, here's what I'd like you to do: On Sundays in Advent, pay attention to the symbols we'll be hanging on the "Jesse Tree" framing our chancel's dorsal cross and listen closely to the stories I'll be telling the children. By packaging adult themes like sibling rivalry and alcohol abuse in kid-friendly stories, the "Jesse Tree" offers us an opportunity to conduct a quick self-examination. Then take what the Holy Spirit gives to you on Sunday and "chew it over" for a few days. By Wednesday, you might be ready for a night without cooking and clean-up that makes time for some extra spiritual reflection and prayer. Whether you think you need it or not, you'll never really know till you give it a try.

Through Justice Resource Institute, we support teens that reside in group homes. These adolescent residential settings specialize in supporting those struggling with depression, anxiety, mood disorders, and PTSD symptoms that lack the appropriate family setting to provide the emotional and educational support needed.

If you have friends outside of the SUMC Community who might be interested in touring, please help us by passing this information on to them as well!

SUMC Families receive Preferential Placement into our programs each year.

We encourage you to visit and if Sunny Hill is your first choice program, submit your application and a \$100 non-refundable enrollment fee prior to December 9, 2016 to ensure your child's preferential placement in our program.
